Overview

During its 1998 Session, the Virginia General Assembly passed House Joint Resolution (HJR) 179, requesting an annual update from the conversion health foundations regarding their charitable activities. In response, the Virginia Consortium for Health Philanthropy is submitting its 2014 Report to the Joint Commission on Health Care, which outlines the activities of Virginia's conversion foundations. This is the 17th annual report from the foundations.

About the Virginia Consortium for Health Philanthropy

The Virginia Consortium for Health Philanthropy (VCHP) has been in existence since 1997 and is a collaborative effort of the health foundations in Virginia. VCHP exists to improve the health of the people of the Commonwealth of Virginia by improving the effectiveness of health philanthropy through collaboration, cooperation and communication among and between health foundations and other key stakeholders. Its members are both hospital conversion and non-conversion foundations with membership limited to grantmaking foundations with a significant focus on health. This includes those foundations which must raise funds to support their grantmaking activities.

VCHP hosts quarterly meetings of its members to provide an opportunity for discussion, information on statewide best practices and new initiatives, and collaboration. Meetings occasionally include members of the Foundations' Board of Trustees and other staff. Topics covered at recent quarterly meeting are: updates and changes in behavioral health (with guest speaker Senator Creigh Deeds), opportunities for collaboration in conjunction with the Virginia Center for Health Innovation, and briefing on the 2015 General Assembly session (with guest Dr. Jennifer Lee). Additionally, the VCHP members seek out funding collaborations and partnerships. The members provided initial funding for the Virginia Atlas for Community Health and Rx Partnership, and many continue to support these initiatives today.
