Commission Meeting October 5, 2021

JCHC directed staff to conduct two complimentary LTC studies

- Impact of long-term care workforce needs on nursing home care
- Strategies to support aging Virginians in their communities

Definition of individuals needing longterm services and supports (LTSS)

Limitations with at least 2 or more activities of daily living (ADL);

- Dressing
- Bathing
- Toileting

Limitations with at least 4 or more instrumental activities of daily living;

- Preparing meals
- Completing household chores
- Taking medications

Or already receiving some form of paid LTSS

- Personal Care
- Private home care (skilled or non-skilled)


LTSS includes a continuum of services and supports

Aging in Place Adult Foster Care Assisted Living Institutional Care Nursing home Home care Family-style residence Congregate care ADI and medical care Personal care Help with daily activities Medical supports Help with ADLs Family caregiving Caregiving Adult day care

A growing number of older Virginians need LTSS

- About 200,000 individuals require some form of LTSS
 - Majority of these individuals are in community settings
 - Approximately 28,000 in nursing facilities
- Individuals over 60 made up 22% of the population in 2019, projected to increase to 24% by 2030
 - 1.9 million older Virginians in 2019
 - 2.2 million estimated older Virginians in 2030

Virginia spent \$1.9B on LTSS in FY21

JCHC studies address two parts of the continuum of care

| Aging in Place | Adult Foster Care | Assisted Living | Institutional Care |
|----------------------|----------------------------|------------------|----------------------|
| Home health supports | Family-style residence | Congregate care | Nursing home |
| Personal care | Help with daily activities | Medical supports | Rehab facility |
| Family caregiving | Caregiving | Help with ADLs | ADL and medical care |
| Adult day care | | | |

Policy options for both studies can complement each other

- Both community and institutional settings require a similar workforce
- Virginia's goal is to maximize aging in place, but some will require nursing home care
- Developing an array of policy solutions can support a continuum of services with an adequate workforce
