Topics Referred to the JCHC

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Current 2023 JCHC Workplan

- Staff Studies
 - Prevention and treatment of obesity and eating disorders
 - Vertically integrated insurance carriers and providers
 - Team-based care approaches in primary care settings
- Other Staff Projects
 - Health care workforce development
 - Prescription drug affordability

NOTE: All studies and staff briefings were approved during the December 7, 2022 JCHC meeting.

Five additional topics have been referred to the JCHC for consideration

Comprehensive school counseling program	HB 2264 (Ransone) and SB 856 (Spruill) referred by committee

Two topics may be more appropriate for other organizations to address

School-based counseling is primarily an education and behavioral health issue

– JCHC could re-refer the topic to either VDOE or the BHC

- Parental rights under surrogacy is primarily a legal issue
 - JCHC could send a letter to the Virginia Family Law Coalition requesting they review the issue and recommend any necessary changes

Two topics can be addressed within existing workload

- Extending current PBM statute to ERISA-regulated plans can be included in prescription drug briefing (SB 1338)
 - Briefing will include a summary federal court decisions on what states can/cannot regulate for ERISA plans
- Staff can work with DMAS to provide information on Medicaid coverage for incarcerated individuals
 - Understand current coverage and coordination between DMAS and DOC
 - Members can determine if further study is necessary

One topic would require significant, additional work

- Privacy standards for consumer-generated health data
 - Policy area receiving attention across the country
 - Would require a full staff study to address the issues
- Could be prioritized over existing studies or considered for 2024

JCHC Health Care Dashboard

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History and purpose of the dashboard

- In 2020, JCHC Members directed staff to develop a set of dashboard metrics related to JCHC strategic objectives
 - Affordability
 - Accessibility
 - Quality
 - Equity
- Purpose was to track progress and identify areas for potential study

Current status of the dashboard

- Dashboard initially launched in 2021
- Metrics address strategic objectives and are chosen to enable comparisons across states and within Virginia
- Metrics are analyzed across different dimensions of equity
 - Race/ethnicity
 - Income
 - Geography
