

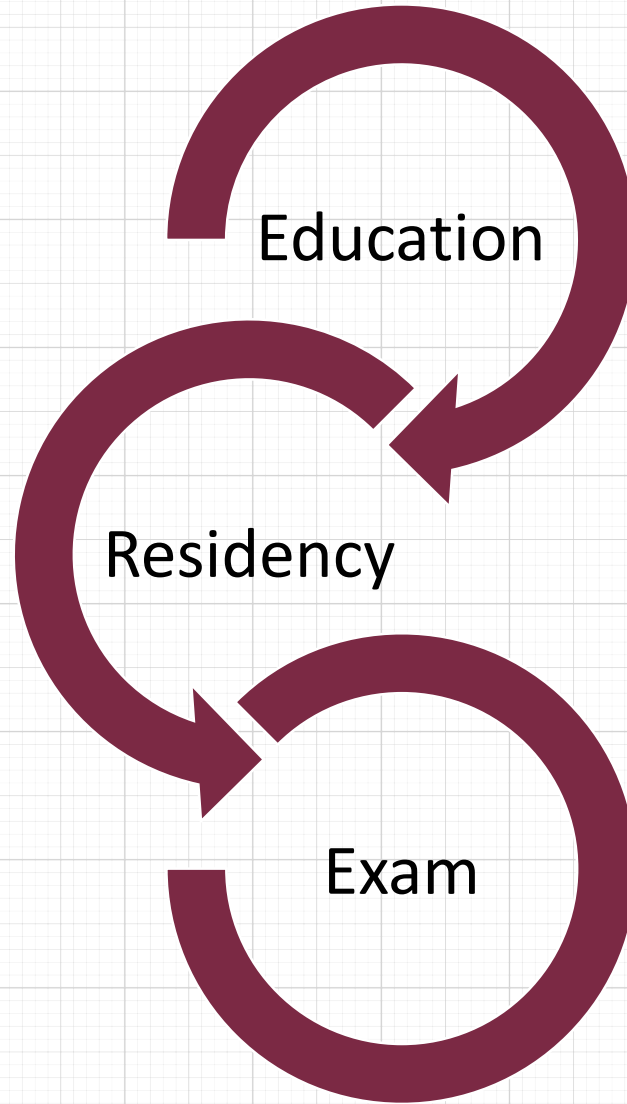

The Path to Licensure as a Professional Counselor



Educational Requirements:

Master's Degree as part of
60 Graduate Credits in Counseling
or a closely related field

Two-years Full-time Study

Internship

Supervised internship of 600 hours to include 240 hours of face-to-face client contact

Up to 900 hours can count towards the licensure requirement

Residency Requirement

3400 hours Post-Graduate
Supervised Experience

Finding a Job

Finding a Supervisor

Getting Registered with the Board

Residency Requirement

- a. Counseling and psychotherapy techniques;
- b. Appraisal, evaluation and diagnostic procedures;
- c. Treatment planning and implementation;

Residency Requirement

- d. Case management and recordkeeping;
- e. Professional identity and function;
- f. Professional ethics and standards of practice.

Residency Requirement

200 Hours of Supervision provided Concurrently
with the Counseling Experience

One Hour per 20 Worked
